Community help needed – please.

I hope that you managed to set aside a little bit of time appreciating all the good things in your life, and all the people who make your life fruitful and worthwhile. Perhaps you managed to also think about how you use your time; whether that is all about work, or whether other things and other people get a look-in on your most precious gift – your time? If you did spend a bit of time thinking, mid-year, about a resolution, then could I ask you to have a think about helping out some other people in the community please?

On the 10th September the local church family at St. Nicholas is launching Blend – an after-school café/club aimed at children in Years 7-10. It is going to be held in the Mission Church, Back Road, Sandhurst - a central point in the village. Blend will be held every Tuesday from 4pm until 6pm in term time; the start time to coincide with the drop-off time of the school buses in the village. We aim to provide a safe space where teens can come to meet with their friends after the school bus has dropped them off, and take part in games and activities (pool, table tennis, board games, crafts), and enjoy milkshakes, cakes and healthier snacks!

Our hope is that Blend will create strong relationships with the young people and also their families. This project has been running successfully at St Mary's Church in Goudhurst for over a year. We have met with the leaders there and they have kindly shared the model that they have evolved. (Between 25 and 40 young people now regularly attend Blend Goudhurst.)

With the mental health and wellbeing of young people a primary concern in our communities, Blend offers not only an opportunity to build friendships between the church and the young people, but also a place for them to be able to talk to mature and caring adults in a safe environment, in confidence, and without judgement.

The Dr. Curteis' Charity Trust has kindly supported this initiative financially; St. Nicholas PCC is also providing the venue, storage and finance, and is underwriting the project. It is hoped that other local businesses and organisations will also get behind this both financially and with offers of equipment and time. And "Time" is where you might come in! We are in need of more adults to help run Blend. (The more volunteers we can get, the less work there is for everyone!) There is a real need to help our youngsters in the village. Can you please help us help them? Please contact myself or Vicki Young if you can get involved with Blend in any way. Thank you. 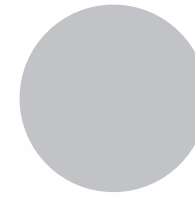

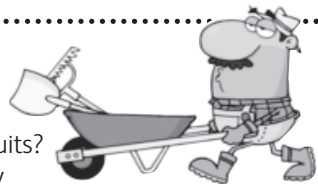

From the Garden Shed

"JUNE DROP" Too much of a good thing? How many apples do you need? Would you prefer fewer but larger fruits? Look out for fallen apples now, the 'June drop' is naturally shedding surplus fruit. View the branches to determine if this left sufficient room for the remaining apples to gain a decent size. If the tree still has clumps remove more by using finger tips; twist rather than a dead downward pull. Space to about 6" between apples left on the tree. This job should be completed by middle of July. Thinning improves the quality and size of the apples harvested, lessens the risk of branches breaking under the weight of fruit, air movement is better around apples when not touching each other, helping to keep trouble at bay, and prevents young trees carrying excess crop restricting their establishment. Start thinning by removing blemished or misshapen fruit; the 'king fruit' ie centre of each cluster, is not necessarily the one to save so do not panic if this falls by mistake, some advice is to remove this usually larger fruitlet anyway.

By now you must know that there will be no Sunday service and the #349 will not come into Sandhurst despite my pleas. They reasoned that more people use the buses from Hawkhurst to Hastings. However, I pointed out that I am one of several who drive to Hawkhurst in order to get the 304/5 which runs hourly. That doesn't mean that Sandhurst should be cut off without use of the #349, which could easily turn around at the green. When I mentioned it at the TAG Transport meeting Stagecoach said that it was already settled, but as usual, alas not in our favour.

Apart from the road being closed we have also been denied a route on the 'Tenterden Hopper'. I put in our request when it was first discussed last year. The bus will come to Iden Green and go back the exact same route through Benenden which already has the Hams #297. I begged them to continue through Iden Green, for an extra 2.8 miles to Sandhurst and go back through Rolvenden. But no, they are running another bus to Rolvenden which already has the #2 and the 'Rolvenden Rocket' which is only available to their residents. To be fair, the powers that be said that they would consider my request again, IF this trial is a success. However, the only way to assure success is to run to places that people want. The rational was that Sandhurst was so well served by buses. Yes, it looks that way on paper, but only one a week goes to Tenterden! It is very frustrating, but I keep trying.

Sandhurst Weather Report for May 2019

May weather was disappointing after the unusual warmth of April. There was a lot of chilly east wind to lower the temperature of the rather hazy sunshine and very little rain except for light showers, mainly in the first half of the month. The total rainfall for the month was just under an inch, a few millimetres more than in April.

The day temperatures ranged between 13 degrees and 20 degrees but rose slightly up to 24 degrees towards the end of the month. Night temperatures were mainly in single figures.

I have been looking back over the May rainfall figures since 2011 and the totals are between 2 and 3 inches and I had to go back to 2010 to find a low of 13 mm, but as I write, June is doing its best to make up any deficit!
