

By example and by teaching, and finally through his sacrifice on the Cross, Jesus shows us the way. The way starts in Bethlehem, and takes us to Jerusalem, but it doesn't end there. It leads on into eternity - but it doesn't leave us behind. We are called, like the shepherds, to get up and go, and put the love of God into practice in our own lives and communities. Christmas offers each of us a chance to share the light which promises new life, a new start. Glory Hallelujah!

At our November gathering members learned of the 'Restoration of the Salutation Garden' also known as The Secret Garden, within the town of Sandwich. Head gardener Steve Edney described how he with his young team have reclaimed this three and half acre garden to its original glory, designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens and possibly assisted by Gertude Jekyll in 1911. Now open to the public throughout the year. The entrance to the grounds through a roofed gateway is similar to that at Great Maytham Hall, Rolvenden, also by Lutyens and erected around the same time. All proceeds of the evening (approx. £100) were donated to the British Legion Poppy Appeal. A further charitable donation from surplus funds of the society has been made to 'Spadework' a local charity supporting those with learning disabilities through horticulture and amenity gardening.

David John Price

July 30th 1927-September 28th 2012

(An edited version of the address given at his funeral by Pastor Ken Slater)

David was born in Wadhurst on the 30th July 1927. He spent his childhood in Wadhurst, attending the local primary school. He sang in the choir earning 2/6d a month and attended Sea Cadets in Tunbridge Wells managing to fit in a paper round - a sign of things to come!

On leaving school he went to work for Stonegate Farmers, until at the age of 17 years + 1 day he joined the Royal Navy. After training at H.M.S. Gangees and aboard H.M.S. Arethusa he also did a six week radar course, later serving on H.M.S. Liverpool.

Now de-mobbed David met Mary at a dance in Wadhurst and two years later they were married in August 1950 at Wadhurst Church. For the first two years of married life they lived with David's mother in Wadhurst, where their son Graham was born in 1951, and in 1952 they moved to Churchsettle, their first family home, where Janet was born in 1954.

In 1964 David and Mary bought a new home in Wadhurst, where Beverley was born in 1967. By this time David had moved to Four Elms at Edenbridge, as an accountant. He became disillusioned with working for others and in 1972 decided on a career change moving to Sandhurst buying the newsagents'. Long hours and hard work were to follow, but also funny and memorable times too! Over the years he had many cars, especially liking the Austin Maxi, owning at least 3 of them! He found they pulled his dry cleaning trailer really well, often leaving in such a hurry that he would forget to shut the trailer door properly, being pulled over by the police on more than one occasion.

Nothing was ever too much for his customers; the shop was often open after hours and became fondly known as "Arkwrights" by many locals. In 1994 David finally retired; tending his plants in his vegetable patch, mowing the grass or picking apples in the orchard - he was still climbing ladders at 81!!

As an avid supporter he went on his first trip to Highbury to watch Arsenal play with his granddaughter Holly and tried his first hamburger!

As a decline in health and mobility made life less busy, he said "goodbye" to his Nova; the vegetable patch began to grow over and the whittling stopped. In spite of all of this David retained a deep interest in all his children, grandchildren and great grand children's welfare continuing to enjoy their visits.

He enjoyed watching life on the bird table and the owls flying over the orchard from the comfort of his much loved armchair!

He counted himself very lucky to have had such a wonderful, caring and loving wife in Mary during their 62 years of marriage and found great comfort in knowing that "My Mary" was there for him, during the last difficult months of his life.

He will be deeply missed by those who knew and loved him.

Name: Richard Cutchley

Role: Captain of Bell-ringers, St. Nicholas Church

How long have you lived/worked in Sandhurst?

I moved into my cottage in 1977 when I was a Kent Police Detective, stationed at Tunbridge Wells.

What is your favourite time of the year and why?

Without doubt the Autumn. The light is beautiful as the Sun is lower in the sky and everything seems to be painted in high golden contrast. There is a chill in the air which makes one hanker for a welcoming log fire. All of nature slows down and I find it very comforting.

What are your interests?

Apart from bell-ringing, I enjoy daily Yoga practice and meditation. I also have five saxophones which keep me occupied. I do not travel far as I prefer to stay where my favourite things are all around me.

What type of music do you like?

My favourite is classical music and modern jazz. I simply love a soul-wrenching "torch ballad" either sung with feeling or played on an instrument (preferably on a tenor saxophone or piano).

Favourite book?

Nowadays I mostly read non-fiction. I like to learn something new, as almost everything that I have ever studied has been self-taught. I have read many classics and once read the whole Bible in a study course. Dickens is a favourite author especially Pickwick Papers and I read A Christmas Carol every December, just to get me in the festive mood.

Favourite pub within a 10 miles radius?

The White Hart at Newenden has always felt like my local. I also now enjoy the Bull at Benenden, which I neglected for too many years. The Swan, in the village, is most welcoming and the food is delicious. I do try to frequent most of the local pubs for lunches. The atmosphere in a good country pub is a delight.

What is the best thing about living here?

I find Sandhurst folk to be the friendliest, politest and most helpful. Good friends are what life is all about. I love the scenery and without exception, every time that I stand on the hill at St. Nicholas church and survey the magnificent views, I cannot take for granted how fortunate we are to live in such an extremely beautiful place.

Is there anything you would like to change about Sandhurst?

I find the heavy flow of traffic very tiresome but there is little that can be done to alter that.



Some still have winter cabbage and Kale and a crop of Christmas salad potatoes on a plot, I will keep you informed on how successful they have been in the spring magazine.


Beds have been dug, turned and topped with manure waiting for hard frost to break the soil down ready for next year.


From our roving correspondent

Some fields already sown are ruined and will have to be ploughed in. For those of us who glean from hedgerow and field things are no better. Our harvest is pretty miserable. Where there were usually sloes there were none. A damson tree normally laden was bare, the blackberries have been small and mean so no blackberry and apple jam or in the freezer. And mushrooms were few and far between. Two years ago we made damson vodka, good but not as good as sloe gin. Alas, this

November Transport Report (Sandhurst)

A change in the weather and a change of the clock will mean that I won't be quite so adventurous for the next few months. I have, however, been checking the buses and I am happy to note that things seem to have settled down from the 'Countryliner' debacle. Autocar have stepped in for some of the routes and I have been highly amused by their website timetable which states-'Direction of stops (where shown)...This is the compass direction towards which the bus is pointing when it stops'!

Another bus schedule item is complaints about the #5 Arriva schedule which only lists what time the bus leaves the stop and not what time it reaches any other points on its route. How can a person, much less a stranger, plan a journey with that scant information?

One way to reach another side of London is to take the Arriva #5 to Maidstone and the train to Victoria. A friend told me that this was very convenient if you are going to the `Victoria Coach Station` for a connection.

I took the 304/305 on a very pleasant trip from Hawkhurst via Robertsbridge to Battle. I even encountered a Guy Fawkes parade and a reenactment of blowing up the Abbey – you never know what you will find when you take a bus ride! `Stagecoach` currently runs this route and if you want to avoid the walk up the hill, just wait until the bus goes around the corner to the British Legion stop.

When I do take my car, instead of the bus, I tend I use Robertsbridge instead of Etchingham – the road crossings are far easier and it is not so isolated. The difference is only 4 minutes. What really annoys me is that it now takes lhr.18-25 mins, when a few years ago it was at least 10 minutes quicker. The problem was that they started fining the companies for being late, so they just added on extra time at each station to avoid the fine – most unfair.

I have yet to try the fast speed train from Ashford to St.Pancras (37 minutes) because I generally need to be on the other side of London. Trains leave every half hour but it appears to be rather expensive with most fares being over £30. However someone told me that a group ticket for four is available for £60.

News from Sandhurst Parish Council

Over the past few months Rosie Broadbent and Wendy Grayburn have been working hard trying to secure grants for improvement work on the Old School. Well, all this hard work has paid off! We have just learnt that we have been awarded KCC and Heritage grants. The final details have still to be confirmed but the awards are of significant value.

The grants are to be focused on repairing the external structure of the hall, which has been somewhat neglected over many years. At either end of the hall, in the gables, are gothic style windows. These are both in need of replacement and, indeed, the west window has had to be boarded up to prevent the glass falling out and injuring people below. Replacement of these windows will be high on the list of priorities for the grant funding. Maintenance of the lower windows, rotten wood and paintwork will also be addressed.

Clock Tower

We decided to tidy up the hedging and rubbish around the clock tower in time for the Remembrance Day commemoration. Thanks to Adam Kerry for his hard work in achieving this in a short time scale. I'm sure that everyone there on Armistice Day noticed the improvement to the clock tower back drop to the War Memorial and garden.
