

Another year draws to a close

With December, the year draws to a close; and another year goes by. A year with, I trust, many happy things to look back on; things that bring a smile to your face as they come to mind. Mixed, I have no doubt, with some hard things that you've had to deal with this year, and perhaps some events that are painful to think back on. I hope that the balance has been towards the happier things of life for you this year.

On this yearly cycle of life, the Church now moves into Advent and then on to Christmas. Advent is a time of preparation for us; preparing ourselves for the celebrations of Christmas, hopefully as we remember - amongst all the wrapping paper, presents, food, drink, and family time – the reason that many are having time off work... we are celebrating the birth of an incredibly special baby about 2000 years ago; a baby who Christians believe, as a man (and as God) came to help us and save us. Advent is also, for the Church, a time of preparing ourselves, more deeply, for the return of Jesus again – whenever that may be. Perhaps it will be in thousands of years, or maybe hundreds of years; or perhaps it will be in your lifetime; or tomorrow. None of us know; but we should be prepared - that is what Advent is about.

The years also move on; this year we are celebrating five Christmases together. I cannot believe where that time has gone. There are plenty of things to share together in the run up to Christmas and over Christmas: I hope we'll meet up at some of them. It all begins with an Advent concert with the Tongswood Choir at the Mission Church on Sunday 3rd December; then an Advent evening together with Revd Rosemary again at the Mission Church on Monday 4th. The Parish Carol Service is on Sunday 17th December, and the Primary School carol service on Monday 18th, both at St. Nicholas Church. And Carols of the Green on Thursday 21st. We've then got a choice of three services on offer on Christmas Eve: Communion at 10am Morning Worship, the Crib Service at 3pm (come dressed as a nativity character – whatever your age!) and 11:30pm for the first Communion of Christmas. On Christmas Day you can then join us for Communion at 8:30am at the Mission Church, or 10am for Family Worship. However, it doesn't end there! If you'd prefer not to be on your own for the rest of Christmas Day, you're welcome to come and have Christmas lunch at the Memorial Hall in Benenden (but please sign up for this in advance by giving me a call or emailing); or drop into the Hall for a drink in the afternoon if you're out and about.

Parts of this year have been very tough for some people, but there is a great community spirit in Sandhurst and the village has come through it together. Now we celebrate Christmas together; happy Christmas.

SAVE OUR SANDHURST ► LOOS - UPDATE YOU CAN KEEP GOING!

I am delighted to report that at their meeting on 14 November the Parish Council voted to keep the loos open on the sportsground. They will remain open for a year but during that time the P.C. will examine the various options and costs. In the meantime some essential repair and maintenance will be carried out and one side of the toilet block will be open as a unisex facility. It may not be ideal, but it is better than nothing.

You may also be interested to know that every effort is being made to get the play equipment on the sportsground repaired as soon as possible. There have been a number of delays as the original contractor went out of business and contractors have to be approved by ROSPA to undertake this work. Some of the equipment was vandalised and this brings me to the next point in asking villagers to keep an eye open for people damaging sites in our lovely village — a few people spoiling things for everyone else - and we have to pick up the cost. Now that we have lost our Community Police Officer the only option is to ring 101 to report suspicious activity.

Thank you everyone who has supported the SOS campaign. Common sense and perseverance paid off. A true village effort. Brilliant!

Roy was born on the 24th April 1973 at Pembury Hospital, a brother for George and another son for Ken and myself. He was a happy child and full of mischief. At four years old he went to playschool then at five years old went on to the primary school in Sandhurst. When seven years old Roy attended Ramsleigh School in Tunbridge Wells then finished his final school years at Angley School, Cranbrook.

After leaving school he went to work at the abattoir in Lamberhurst, which he loved. He worked there until the foot and mouth disease closed it down. From there he went to work with his brother George at East West Ales in Paddock Wood. When that closed Roy found work at Hoads Farm in Sandhurst and that is where he stayed. He liked the work and, also the Nicholas family. When it comes "Hopping" he looked forward to seeing his friends from Wales.

At weekends he enjoyed being with all his friends. On Sunday at lunchtime he'd say he was "Going to church to lift my left arm". That "church" was the social club in Sandhurst.

Growing up he loved most animals, (not cats). However, Patch a black and white cat walked into his life and he loved her as much as she loved him! Roy also liked gardening with his Dad, helping to mow the lawns at different places Ken worked. Another interest was Steam Engines, Roy and a friend would go to Steam Rallies to show them. Karate was another thing he got into, and he enjoyed doing it, passing grading and taking part in competitions.

Music was also a passion, eclectic taste from Country and Western, Rock and Roll, Rock bands and up to the music of today. He would come home from work or wherever he'd been and say "you don't want to listen to that rubbish" and put on the Quireboys or The Levellers and we'd dance around the room.

On September 25th the house where we lived became his, he would have been the proud owner of a house but did not have time to enjoy.

From the Garden Shed

BUDDLEIAS: Did you know the John Lewis Partnership owns the largest buddleia collection in England, the nursery, Longstock Park, Stockbridge in Hampshire, selling more than a thousand pot-grown specimens each year.

Mainstream buddleias, as we know, are trouble free but can quickly outgrow their allotted space. The remedy is to cut the bush down to one foot from ground level in March. Be brave, the new shoots will already be growing strongly, but the plant will survive to be covered in flowers by august when dead-heading of blooms will maintain the flowering season well into september.

There are many new varieties, of differing growth habit eg. silver leaf, variegated and weeping forms, and a choice of white, yellow, pink or blue (light or dark) flowers. Do not dismiss as 'railway embankment shrubs', these modern buddleias are very rewarding.


The Bakers down under

Today I picked up a brochure in Aldi which proclaimed, "It is BBQ season", and it totally threw me. I had to look twice in case I had got an out-of-date publication. Like so much of the world our weather seems to be unreliable. Is this climate change do you suppose? So many floods, bad storms and earthquakes it is hard to decide. In one week we have had 30+ one day and 15 the next, but there is a gradual warming happening.

We are looking forward to the rose and garden show in a few days' time, which is only a short drive from us. It is always held at the State Rose Garden of Victoria. Strange that in a seemingly hostile climate roses thrive. Every roundabout on our estate is

planted with white roses and they bloom all year. At the moment they are putting on such a beautiful display. Perhaps we should try some in the garden. Our olive tree is in full flower and we have tiny passion fruit on the vine. With the lemons fruiting and the lime tree blossoming it is quite a tropical oasis.

Good Christian MEN, Rejoice and Good King Wencelas

The Reverend John Mason Neale (1818-1866), the scholarly Anglican priest and noted hymn translator responsible for Veni, Emanuel (O Come, O Come Emanuel), also wrote the lyrics for two familiar English carols: Good Christian Men, Rejoice and Good King Wenceslas. The words for both appeared in his 1853 publication Carols for Christmas-tide.

Good Christian Men, Rejoice, is a loose interpretation of In Dulci Jubilo (meaning "a sweet rejoicing"), a late medieval Latin-German carol that first appeared in Klug's 1533 Geistliche Lieder, a Lutheran hymnal, and later published in Piae Cantiones, a 1582 Finish songbook. The lyrics may have come from Heinrich Seuse (c.1295-1366), a German mystic and Dominican monk. According to legend, the Blessed Heinrich Seuse (or Henry Suso) was visited by heavenly angels in a dream, danced and sang with them, and then when he awoke immediately wrote the words.

Piae Cantiones, a renowned compilation of carols, also contained the music for a Swedish spring carol titled Tempest Adest Floridum, an anonymous 13th-century tune which the redoubtable Rev. Neale coupled to his lyrics for Good King Wenceslas. His textual substitution seemed entirely fanciful, and it was even scorned by critics from both the literary-music class and the Anglican hierarchy, the latter who felt Rev. Neale's religious instincts aligned too closely with the Roman Catholic Church.

In search of a good role model for children, the Rev. Neale found inspiration for his Good King Wenceslas from a story about the nobleman Wenceslas (c. 907-929), the Duke of Bohemia, a kind man raised by a devoted grandmother. Wenceslas later became king, and during his reign he converted his country to Christianity, providing his people with a period of great serenity. For Christmas, he decreed that it should be celebrated in every cottage and church throughout the land. Known to be a just and merciful king with considerable compassion for the poor and sick, his reign as king was short-lived. In 929, he was assassinated by an evil younger brother who conspired with other family members and the pagan nobility against him. Because of the young monarch's exemplary life, Good King Wenceslas was born, and despite its confounding lyrics, it has since become a Christmas favorite for children and adults alike.

Lastly, the tremendous contributions of Rev. Neale to hymnody and carols, and to the least advantaged in life, were finally recognized one hundred years later by the Anglican Church. On July 24, 1966, the Archbishop of Canterbury dedicated a memorial in Rev. Neale's honor at his grave in St. Swithun churchyard in East Grinstead, England. *Amen. Amen.*

Christmas in the Twenties

We came to Sandhurst shortly before Christmas 1920, just in time to order a goose from the nearby farm. On Christmas Eve it was handed in feathers and innards intact. My father, with spade and knife, performed a gruesome operation in the garden, then all five of us got down to plucking. It was not a white Christmas, but our house contained a blizzard with flakes lingering into Spring.

Subsequent Christmases went better. Our conveniently agnostic father guarded the dinner while we four took the footpath to church which we had previously decorated leaving holly leaves on certain pews. Undeterred by the smell of mothballs from the furs of the upper crust, we joined zealously in with the carols, my brother employing schoolboy versions such as "shepherds washing their socks by night".

A week before this, we combined with friends to hire a trap and a chestnut mare from Mr Rummery of Malthouse Farm and drove to Hawkhurst to do our Christmas shopping. A few years later, perhaps due to the mare's demise, we walked to the junction at Newenden and caught a bus to the great town of Tenterden; walking back in the gloaming with bulging bags.

A big seasonal feature was the Nativity play in the Old School. Usually a lesser shepherd, I was once promoted to Joseph, complete with a very prickly beard. My elder sister was the Angel Gabriel, an exacting part in many ways for her magnificent wings were inadequately fixed and threatened to capsize at her most dramatic utterance.

Several mothers combined to give a fancy-dress party at the same venue. We danced Sir Roger, played musical chairs and oranges and lemons, dived into a bran tub and took part in a curious team game consisting of passing the outer case of a matchbox from nose to nose.

I think I most enjoyed the parties in houses, for this meant walking back in the dark by the bobbing light of a storm lantern. No tame electrics lit the Christmas trees but real candles. There was that lovely smell of singeing pine needles and often a dash to save the whole tree from catching fire. Then there was the Christmas concert with an all star cast which hardly varied: Mr Hardy's female impersonations, Mr Jempson reciting a poem on why his house was called "The Cloisters" — it was closeter to the church and closeter to the pub and closeter to the workhouse tool. Mr Booth gave a song about his Old Leather Breeches, which raised adult eyebrows but passed us. With no television, telephone and, at least for some years, no radio, how remote from the big commercial world we were! For us Sandhurst was the best of places, for me it still is.

Sandhurst Weather Report for October

Once again October proved to be a very quiet month with fairly warm days, light winds and no night frosts, so the leaves continued to fall slowly from the trees of hornbeam and ash, while the oaks held theirs with little sign of autumn colour, but maples and cherries began to put on a show.

Rainfall was low, only 41 mm or one and a half inches, which mainly fell on three wet nights on 19th, 20th and 21st when there were 10 mm on each one.

In other parts of the country, winds were quite strong and Storm Brian caused some damage in the West. People remembered how we suffered back in 1987, but no damaging winds came inland here for which we should be thankful.
