Sandhurst Weather Report for December 2018

December saw a spell of very settled weather mild and damp with very light winds and some sunny days. Day temperatures were in the low teens except for a slightly colder few days from the 11th to the 15th when they dipped to single figures and the nights were near freezing. Christmas Day was sunny and mild and the whole holiday period was quiet and mild so no travel disruptions on the roads.

The rainfall for the month occurred mainly in the first week and then again between the 12th and 23rd with a total for the month of 92mm -nearly 4inches, which boosted the total for the year to 774.5mm (a respectable 31inches) which is nothing like a drought. June was the driest month with only 7mm and November the wettest with 138mm (just under 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches).

We enjoyed a long warm and sunny summer from mid-June to the end of October. Some would say it was too hot at times and keen gardeners had to water a lot; but fruit flowers and vegetables all did well and holiday makers did not have to go abroad to find the sun

What a great start to the New Year, we had forty four people attending our January meeting! It was an excellent evening 'Willow Weaving demonstration and talk' by Dominic Parrette.

Dominic is a Sussex based basket maker, willow grower and teacher specialising in traditional frame baskets, organically woven willow forms and beautiful strong plant supports. He makes woven products for small gardens and allotments as well as taking on commissions for the National Trust, Kew and Wakehurst.

During the first part of the presentation Dominic explained about growing and harvesting willow, he then demonstrated how to make a strong willow plant support. Once completed, everyone was given a piece of willow and taught the basics of willow weaving, which was great fun.

From the Garden Shed

A WINTER STROLL round the borders left me wondering what one may do to provide a little colour this time next year ahead of spring bulbs. A possible solution came in the form of a Malus (crab apple) tree.



Planting time now; blossom to look forward to in the

spring, red fruits (apples) during the summer and if an appropriate variety could be found, crab apple jelly to consume next winter; red fruit left hanging would provide birds with an early Christmas feast. Most borders could do with the addition of some 'height` to lift the eye above the rather bare ground. Luckily crab apples come in all tree shapes and fruit colour.

Two trees have been chosen, the first a familiar variety to me, Malus 'red sentinal', this has served its purpose very well over many years and the small apples, resembling berries, remain until early spring. The second, 'jelly king', the plant label declaring it 'excellent as a provider of apples suitable for jelly making'. Large orangepink fruit persisting longer on the tree than most. Flowering in April, scented, tolerant of clay, disease resistant and very little pruning required. I have just planted these and hope to see new growth very soon!





Sandhurst Travel Report

The long-awaited 26-to-30 railcard - known as the Millennial Railcard - went on sale at midday on Wednesday. Jan 4th. It offers a third off most leisure fares.



And a new 16-to-17 railcard to be launched in the summer, will offer 50% off all fares. The idea is to help students travelling to school or college.

Bus operator Stagecoach has confirmed that the start time of its popular 'Evening Rider' ticket will remain at 6pm indefinitely. The bus company adjusted the start time in November bringing it forward an hour so that Christmas shoppers and party goers could benefit from an extra hour's unlimited bus travel. Now the company will make the change permanent allowing bus travellers to use the ticket from 6pm everyday. The Evening Rider ticket, which costs just £3 on the bus firm's smartphone app, is valid for unlimited travel on all Stagecoach buses in the south east.

I recently planned a Wednesday morning trip to Hawkhurst but, alas, the No5 was delayed. However, as luck would have it, the No255 showed up. It is now being run by `Autocar` and goes to Tunbridge Wells via Hawkhurst. On the return journey, I had a choice of either the No349 or the No5. There is talk of a `taxi-bus` service to Tenterden being sponsored by KCC. Unfortunately their plans do not include either Sandhurst or Hawkhurst, so when it was discussed at the TAG (transport) meeting, I put in an appeal to consider our two villages. It is proposed to come to Iden Green and I pointed out that Sandhurst is just 3 miles further.
