Once again I have received a few letters (one anonymous, which doesn't help) about the state of the churchyard in both parishes; but I also frequently receive comments about "how beautiful" the churchyards are. (As I've said before, the churchyards seem to be generate a "Marmite" reaction!) Both are maintained by the hard work of volunteers. 

From the Garden Shed

TREE AND SHRUB BOOST: Old fruit trees do not require much extra nourishment, but they will still be grateful for a little bone meal and compost, assuming the ground around their trunks is free of grass, otherwise, you are just boosting the grass. Bone meal, an organic 'slow to release'



fertiliser, will increase the humus content of your soil and provide nutrition next spring just as the tree is bursting into life.

If an old fruit tree has stopped growing, looking tired or has become less productive, add fertilizer as it may be suffering from a nutrient deficiency. The majority of nutrients are taken up by the tree through the more delicate roots, ie. not near the trunk or thickest roots, but in a circle much further out, this is where bone meal will have greatest impact.

One method to ensure that nutrients added have maximum effect is by digging holes roughly twelve inches deep at three feet intervals, placing a handful of bone meal into each and watering well before returning the removed soil; the autumn and winter rains will continue to assist in releasing the goodness with which to feed those tiny roots. Spreading fertiliser on the surface where grass exists will not benefit your tree. The above action will provide a boost to any shrub, fruiting or ornamental. Just a word of caution, bone meal can attract foxes if not buried. JRE




